

Thessaloniki International Airport "Makedonia" (SKG)

The International Airport "Macedonia" (SKG) connects Thessaloniki with more than 30 countries and 60 foreign cities with direct flights, as well as 35 cities and islands in Greece.

Transportation from the airport: The airport is connected to Line 1 of the subway system at Nea Elvetia via the 02X shuttle bus. The bus terminal is located in the "Arrivals" area, in front of Exit 4 of Terminal 1. Tickets can be purchased at the terminal from the ticket booth or the automated ticket machines of OASTH (<u>https://www.oasth.gr/en/</u>).


A 24/7 taxi service is also available, with fares ranging from €25 to €35 to the center of Thessaloniki.

*Location

<u>About Thessaloniki</u>

Thessaloniki city story begins with its founding in 316/315 BC. From the outset, it bore a regal connection—its name was taken from Thessaloniki, sister of Alexander the Great and daughter of Philip II, King of Macedonia. Owing to its strategic position, the city soon became a major port and commercial hub for Macedonia and the broader Balkan Peninsula—a role it has upheld for over two millennia.

Thessaloniki is the most significant administrative, cultural, and business hub in northern Greece, as well as the country's second-largest city. Home to over 1.1 million people in its wider metropolitan area, this mid-sized city lies on the shores of the Thermaic Gulf and boasts over 50 kilometers of coastline. In 2014, a major redevelopment of the urban waterfront was completed, offering a unique space for walking, running, and cycling. Conveniently located near the Aegean Sea, Thessaloniki is only about an hour's drive from majestic Mount Olympus and the Chalkidiki region's beautiful beaches and just a short flight away from several Balkan and Mediterranean capitals.

The city's pleasant Mediterranean climate features hot, dry summers, typically moderated by sea breezes and mild, wetter winters. Spring and autumn often bring occasional rainfall and comfortable temperatures, making Thessaloniki an appealing destination year-round for tourists and residents.

Thessaloniki's rich cultural scene includes 30 museums and 15 UNESCO World Heritage Sites, reflecting its long history and diverse influences. It offers flights to 81 international destinations in 31 countries, plus 35 domestic routes, making travel to and from the city both accessible and convenient. Notably, one can walk from its eastern to its western edge in just 30 minutes, highlighting Thessaloniki's highly compact and walkable center.

Food and nightlife are integral to the local lifestyle. The New York Times recognized Thessaloniki as one of the 52 places to visit in 2016, emphasizing its exceptional gastronomy. According to National Geographic, Thessaloniki has more cafés per capita than any other European city, and it was listed among the "Top 10 Nightlife Cities" for 2015 and "Best Trips 2013." As the country's largest student city, it hosts around 150,000 Greek and international students each year, supported by leading institutions such as Aristotle University (the largest in Greece and the Balkans), the University of Macedonia, and other prominent colleges. Since 2014, the "Study in Thessaloniki" initiative has aimed to attract even more students from around the globe, further cementing the city's reputation as a vibrant, cosmopolitan center.


